

GAP's Internship Stipend Policy

GAP pays its interns one lump-sum stipend at the end of any completed internship. Payment amounts are as follows:

- **Graduate Students** -- those who are currently enrolled fulltime in an accredited graduate level program and have already completed some classes, or those who have already completed a graduate program -- are entitled to a stipend amount of \$1,750 at the end of a 12-week internship.
- **Undergraduate Students** -- those who have not yet graduated from an undergraduate institution, or those who have but have not yet began fulltime enrollment in a graduate program -- are entitled to \$1,000 at the end of a 12-week internship.

For each internship above, the stipend amount is based on 12 weeks of fulltime work to be completed in the GAP office. Fulltime work is considered to be 40 hours per week, with time off for holidays. Missed time results in a prorated stipend.

Students who are receiving credit for their internships are still eligible for the stipend. However, those students who are being paid from a third party (such as a school, business, or scholarship) for completing the internship will not receive stipends, provided that the third party payment is more than the GAP stipend for such an internship. If such payment is below the GAP stipend level, GAP will pay the difference.
